### MESSAGE FOR LENT

Lent began last week on Ash Wednesday. The College celebrated this important event in the Church's year with a liturgy in Parish church. Traditionally Catholics give up something during Lent. It was common during my schooling that forgoing something from the tuckshop during Lent would mean I could donate to Caritas which does a terrific job in assisting people in need. This is certainly a tradition we support at the College and students have the opportunity to donate in their homerooms to this cause. Last year Father James Martin S.J. a Jesuit priest from the USA posed the following challenge;

"Well, instead of giving something up how about doing something positive. How about this: Be kind."

This certainly fits with our 2020 theme of 'Be the good'.

### CORONAVIRUS

The following is an update from the Catholic School's Office, Lismore. Please note there has been no specific concern at Mt St Patrick College up to this point and this notice is standard for the entire Diocese. We would like to keep the community informed but not alarmed.

*To ensure the continued health and wellbeing of our students, staff and school communities, the following update is provided in relation to COVID-19 (previously referred to as Novel Coronavirus):*

*Any student or staff member who has been in, or transited through, mainland China (not just Hubei province) or has been in Iran is excluded from work, school or child care services for 14 days from the date they left mainland China or Iran (as the COVID-19 incubation period can be as long as two weeks).*

*Any confirmed case of COVID-19 will be excluded until they are medically cleared to return.*

*Close contacts of a confirmed case of COVID-19 will be excluded for 14 days since last contact with the confirmed case.*

*Students and staff who have returned to Australia from mainland China or Iran more than 14 days ago and have shown no symptoms are able to return to school.*

### FLOOD FEEDBACK

Following the school closing due to the recent flooding in Murwillumbah, the Parish, the Principals of Mt St Patrick Primary, Mt St Patrick College and St Joseph's South Murwillumbah met to review procedures to ensure our decision-making process is as good as can be at the time. It will not be perfect because there are so many variables to consider. I want to thank the College community for their understanding during this time. It is the policy of the Parish and parish schools that we make any decision about closing schools together.

I will publish the fully updated procedures in the coming weeks when they are completed. In the meantime, I wanted to remind people that is important that we have correct mobile phone numbers for parents and guardians as the quickest way to distribute information is via text message.

## FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

### NSW HEALTH SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM

At Mt St Patrick College the first round of immunisations will take place on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> March 2020, for Year 7 (HPV Dose 1 and /or Boostrix) and catch ups for Year 8 HPV (if commenced in 2019). A Parent Information Kit was sent home with students on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> March or Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> March. Consent Forms need to be returned to the student's homeroom teacher by Friday 20<sup>th</sup> March, 2020 if parents want their student immunized.

The second round of immunisation will take place on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> June for Year 10 students (Meningococcal) and catch ups from Year 7 and 8 from Round 1. The Parent Information Kits will be sent home via students on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> May.

### ANZAC DAY: MURWILLUMBAH

This year Anzac Day will occur on the Saturday before Term 2 begins for NSW schools. The College Band and Drumline will be leading the Murwillumbah March and will accompany the various hymns and anthems at the service.

As is our tradition, students and staff are encouraged to march as a group following our College banner and senior leaders. Students who wish to march should assemble on the footpath opposite the Murwillumbah Post Office at 10am in full dress uniform, including the College hat (and sunscreen), ready for the 10.30am March to the Cenotaph service which usually finishes by approx. 11.25am.

## FROM THE CURRICULUM CO-ORDINATOR

### HOMEWORK

Homework is an important aspect of learning to study for secondary students. Regular homework can help students develop a routine which will reinforce ideas learnt at school and to find study techniques that suit their individual learning style.

The recommended time for Homework and assessments is:

Year 7 and 8 – 1hr five times a week

Year 9 and 10- 1.5 hrs five times a week

Year 11- 2 hrs five times a week

Year 12- 3 hrs five times a week

Parents can support their child by ensuring the time is available for the child to complete the homework amongst all the activities that they are involved in after school. Providing an organised, quiet study space is another important opportunity to support your child. Staying up to date with the assessment calendar; discussing with your child when assessments are due and organising social activities around the tasks can assist students to develop good organisation skills.

Please monitor your child's homework and if they are not getting the required amount, or if they appear to be doing too much, please send their homeroom teacher or myself an email at the College, or write in their diary, to allow me to remedy the situation.

### MINISTRY

#### LEAD CONFERENCE AND STUDENT DISCIPLESHIP

As part of Proclaim Lismore, a comprehensive continuum of Intentional Student Discipleship Programs has been developed for students from Year 5 to Year 12. These gatherings aim to bring Catholic secondary students together to encounter like-minded peers and to celebrate and meet with other young people who practice their faith.

LEAD is a Student Leaders Conference that enhances School Youth Ministry Teams of Years 11 and 12 students to be equipped for ministry in their schools, by nurturing their own faith and developing them into supportive communities. Returning from LEAD, these students will be encouraged to meet regularly to support each other and to facilitate Youth Ministry Initiatives within their own school communities and at regional events such as SHINE. LEAD will take place on 19th and 20th March, 2020 at McAuley Catholic College, Grafton.



The gathering will include:

- Dynamic keynote speakers
- The Lismore Diocese Youth Ministry Officers as part of the CSYMA Youth Ministry Australia (YMI) Team
- SHINE-style rally on Thursday night
- Mass
- Small Group Discussions
- Seminars and Interactive workshops to provide formation and equip with youth ministry skills.

Student participation in this year's LEAD will include any Year 11 and 12 students who are interested in being active in Senior Youth Ministry at Mt St Patrick.

### TRANSITUS

Transitus is a retreat for invited Year 7 students from Parish Secondary Schools in the North of the Diocese to create a smoother transition to secondary schools, celebrate and be nurtured in their faith at a diocesan level.

The retreat will be a chance to bring students together to meet like-minded peers and to celebrate with other young people who want to grow and be supported in their Christian faith. The activities will be a mixture of large and small sharing groups as well as celebrating the Eucharist together. The program has been geared to meet the needs of these Year 7 students.

The gathering will be an overnight experience that will allow students to build relationships with other students from throughout the Diocese as well as a chance for students to talk and share about their faith journey.

What: Transitus – a youth retreat for Year 7 students from every Parish school in the Northern Region of the Diocese.

When: Thursday 26th -Friday 27th March

Where: Camp Koinonia, Evans Head

Cost: Nil. All transport, food and accommodation expenses will be met by the Catholic Schools Office.

This retreat is for students who:

- o Regularly attend Mass
- o Are involved in some other form of Church involvement either at school or in the parish
- o who show initiative, common sense and maturity and are seeking to grow in these areas
- o are willing to learn more about the Christian Faith.

A number of MSPC students have already expressed an interest in this retreat. We can, however, only offer 14 places. Any student who would like to be considered is asked to complete the Student Application Form provided by Mr O'Donohue and available at the front office. Attention should be given to the stated selection criteria. Nominations should be handed to the Office no later than Friday 13th March.

### **YEAR 10 RETREAT**

The Year 10 Retreat is coming up next week from Wednesday 11th March to Friday 13th March at Camp Bornhoffen. This is an important opportunity for students to reflect upon their lives in a very busy year, especially their relationships with family, friends and God. A letter regarding details (eg cost \$200.00) was emailed and students have received their requisites list. Students are reminded to return their permission notes to the College Office by tomorrow Friday 6th March.

The retreats are seen as integral to the philosophy and ethos of the College and therefore the retreat is compulsory for all students. It is also an essential part of their holistic development. If students are unable to go for any reason, they should see our principal, Mr Paul Reidy, or myself. Parents are asked to ring the College if further clarification is needed.

## SCHOOL COMPUTERS UPDATE

### YEAR 7 AND 10 LAPTOP/HYBRID COMPUTER ROLLOUT

Year 10 and 7 students will have just received their new hybrid tablet laptops. For most students their ipad and computer skills will transfer over to the new laptop, however there are some new and important features around digital inking that will require some upskilling by students. We will be running tutorial sessions during classes over the next term to encourage students to effectively utilise the new features of the device.



As the pens that come with the device are very expensive to replace, all students in Year 7 and 10 are required to use the school issued case, as the pen is attached to the case. Each student's pen has been labelled, however if this rubs off over time, you may need a Sharpie or Nikko pen to reapply your child's name. The students are able to use the pen directly from the device so the pen will never need to be removed from its tether. We will have a small amount of pens available at the Learning Hub to borrow for one day at a time if a pen breaks, however if a pen is lost a new one will need to be purchased from the office at cost price (Approximately \$120). If students abide by the policy of not removing the pen from the case, hopefully this will be a non-issue.

**I would like to remind parents that as per our Terms and Conditions, if a student leaves the College prior to completing the term of their computer agreement or moves to another College, interstate or overseas, the computer MUST be paid out in full and returned to the IT Help Desk for reimaging before being returned to the student.**

Approximately \$250 of the computer price is dedicated to the warranty, which includes 3 claims per calendar year. Screen breakages are the most common breakage, which if not covered by warranty would cost approximately \$700 to replace. For students leaving the College, when you buy your computer out, it comes with this warranty for you to use for the 3 year life of the policy. Please note that each claim comes with a \$55 excess.
