



Dear Parents and Carers,

COVID-19 (Coronavirus)

The College, like the wider community, is faced with circumstances that are changing rapidly. No sooner had I sent an email last week to the community regarding the cancellation of sport with other schools and professional development, but that we would continue with assemblies and mass than the advice was changed. We are no longer having assemblies and our St Patrick's Day Mass was cancelled. This was disappointing, but necessary. As I have said in previous correspondence, the College is being advised by the Lismore Catholic Schools' Office who are liaising with NSW Health. The current advice is that it is better for schools to remain open. Staff are being upskilled for the potential of students and/or staff working from home. I want to thank staff for the positive manner in which they have approached this preparation. It shows their commitment to our students.

Today you were sent Online Learning Guidelines for Parents/Caregivers which will assist in supporting both students and the College. There was also a survey informing us of your internet capabilities at home. I ask that you complete this for us to enable the College to meet your student's needs.

I understand that the school has sent multiple communications out to you. Because of the changing nature of the situation, this is unavoidable if we are to keep you up to date. I will try and be clear and succinct with any updates.

You may hear rumours about students being away from the College. I can assure you if the College is aware of any confirmed cases we will act quickly. If school was to close the College would send both an email and a text informing you of this. I also understand that although the College is open some parents are uneasy about sending their children to school in this climate. The College will provide both traditional learning at the College and resources for learning at home to try and cater for all students.

I would urge you to be conservative in your actions regarding the health and safety of you and your loved ones. I am encouraging our community to be calm and follow the advice as it comes to us.

Both the Federal Government Health and NSW Health Departments have the latest information.

In the midst of panic scenes on the news of people at supermarkets fighting over toilet paper, it was a pleasure to speak to Year 12 students during lunchtimes this week. They were informed but calm and positive. They are a terrific example to us of how we need to approach these troubling times. I know they also had a reassuring and calming influence on me which I am appreciative of. It speaks volumes of the culture of Mt St Patrick College that has been nurtured over many years by compassionate and passionate educators.

NSW HEALTH SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM

A Parent Information Kit was sent home with students on Wednesday 4th March or Thursday 5th March. Immunisation for Year 10 students (Meningococcal) will take place on Wednesday 17th June and catch ups from Year 7 and 8 from 25th March. The Parent Information Kits will be sent home via students on Wednesday 27th May.

FROM THE CURRICULUM CO-ORDINATOR

ASSESSMENTS DURING CORONAVIRUS DISRUPTIONS

During these very uncertain times maintaining integrity in College Assessment is a challenge. Whilst the school is open we will continue with our usual assessment policies and procedures.

Assessment Rules

1. Assessments are designed to give valuable feedback to staff and students which will guide Teaching and Learning. They also enable the College to allocate appropriate grades.
2. The Assessment Calendars are found on the College website. <https://msplism.com/calendars/> Please check and discuss with your teacher, any issues immediately.
3. Absent from a Task-
Text the College before 9.00am on the day detailing reason.

Report to your subject teacher before 9.00am on the day of return to organise to complete the task. Failure to do so results in a zero score. Year 10-12 students must present a Doctor's certificate to the teacher when absent from a task. Please note a family holiday is not a suitable excuse to miss an assessment task.

4. If you know you will be absent from a task for any reason please fill in a variation to assessment form and present it to your teacher at least 3 days before the task.
5. Late Tasks- deduction of 20% per day late. After 3 days a zero is recorded.
6. Plagiarism can result in a zero being recorded for all participants.

Recently students who are unwell in Years 10-12 have contacted me to say it is difficult to gain an appointment at the Doctors to get a Doctor's Certificate. An alternative is to receive a medical certificate from a Pharmacy. It has been possible for some of these students to come in and complete their task and then return home if their illness doesn't prevent them.

Students who are currently in compulsory social isolation due to being in contact with a diagnosed case or who have returned from holidays can contact their teachers to discuss assessments.

YEAR 12 ASSESSMENTS

At this stage Year 12 mid-course assessments will commence on Wednesday 1st April 2020. Students should continue to prepare for them and teachers will inform them if there are any required modifications. It is important that Year 12, in particular, attempt to maintain focus in these uncertain times. When everything settles down there will be an HSC to complete.

CONTINUITY OF EDUCATION

It is important that Mt St Patrick students push forward with their Academic Program so as to minimize the impact on their educational progress. Staff are currently ensuring that affected students are receiving lessons via email/ google classroom or moodle. If a student is concerned they should contact their teachers.

Students travelled out to Bornhoffen Camp, 45 minutes out of Murwillumbah, on Wednesday 11th March with a record number of attendees. Despite the cool windy environment, students were able to get a deeper understanding of themselves, their peers and God. The relationships that were strengthened and formed will have a positive impact within our College environment and therefore create a stronger sense of community.

Day One involved the breaking down of barriers. The formation of a more comfortable environment established new found relationships and connections with our peers. There were a few nerves and some tension, however, as the day progressed, everyone had a sense of belonging within the cohort. A significant activity allowed for letting go of the burdens of our past wrong doings whilst encouraging a more peaceful and open-minded experience.

LITERACY AND NUMERACY: NAPLAN 2020

NAPLAN Online Readiness Test

All NSW schools are required to participate in a school readiness test for NAPLAN Online on Monday 23rd March. The school readiness test is a 'practice run' for schools to assess their technology ahead of NAPLAN Online (held in May). The readiness test is not an assessment of student ability. The readiness test allows schools to:

- become familiar with the NAPLAN Online test format and processes;
- check whether they have the technical capacity, rooms and devices to administer NAPLAN Online;
- provide students in NAPLAN Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 with the opportunity to experience the online test question types and format by completing a practice NAPLAN online test.

All Year 7 and 9 students are required to have a fully charged laptop and headphones on Monday 23rd March.
