The Catholic Schools Office Lismore, has created the **Voices from the field - Discerning the New Normal** to craft the 'new normal' for our schools by asking the question 'What are we learning from this experience that will change the way we **learn**, **lead** and **educate** into the future?' Students, staff and parents are being surveyed across the Diocese to assist in this process. Parents will be asked to provide input soon and I ask that you take this opportunity to assist in our decision-making into the future.

As a Catholic school, in the Presentation tradition, we want to see the values espoused by Jesus and championed by Nano Nagle, in practice. Some of these values involve sharing our gifts, pursuing justice, and having concern for the poor and marginalised. The positive manner in which students raised the issue of racial inequality in the past week displays this value and their desire to be active and engaged participants in positive change in the world, and I commend them for it. Tomorrow's 'Crazy Sock Day' will provide financial assistance to our local St Vincent de Paul Conference to provide practical help in the Murwillumbah area.

ASSESSMENT TIME

Students in all year groups are currently completing Assessment Tasks. The assessments are designed to give students, teachers and parents feedback on the students' learning so that the teachers can design the learning to suit the student's needs. Parents and students are reminded about the procedure for being absent from a task:

- Text the College to inform the teacher that the student will be absent from the task
- On the day of return the student is responsible to report to the subject teacher and organise to complete the task. Year 10-12 students require a Doctor's Certificate.
- Late tasks will be penalised 20% each day late and a zero will be recorded after 3 days.

YEAR 11 ASSESSMENT PERIOD

Year 11 Assessments commence on Thursday 25th June. A variety of tasks will be conducted or handed in during that period. Year 11 students are only required at the College when they are completing a task and are asked to be in full school uniform when at the College. Study rooms will be provided for students during this time for those reliant on buses or wanting to avoid distractions at home.

YEAR 10 SUBJECT SELECTION

Year 10 students commenced this process by attending subject talks in the Gilbey Centre on Wednesday 10th June. They are now in the process of completing a survey form so that the Leaders of Learning can provide feedback on their choices. These surveys are due to the office by next Monday 22nd June. An interview day will be provided on Thursday 23rd July where the students' pathways can be discussed. Each student will book in an interview time with a teacher to discuss the survey sheet. Parents can attend the interview if they would like. The interview times range from 7.30 am to 7.15 pm. An invitation to these interviews will be sent to Year 10 next week.

Year 12 students have received their reports. Year 7 students will receive their reports by the end of the term. Due to COVID and remote learning Year 8 – 11 reports will be provided early next term. An opportunity for parents to discuss the reports will be provided.
