FROM THE CURRICULUM CO-ORDINATOR

Term 3 is an exciting time for Year 8 and 10 students as they choose subjects for 2021.

Year 8

Year 8 parents will be sent a video this week that presents the subject selection process for Year 9 and 10 electives. Each Leader of Learning has recorded a presentation of the subjects on offer in their faculty. Mt St Patrick College has 16 subjects on offer. The students get to select a 200 hour subject which they study in Years 9 and 10. They also select two 100 hour subjects. One 100 hour subject studied in Year 9 and another in Year 10.

The Stage 5 Curriculum booklet can be found on the College Corporate website which details each subject. The first stage of the selections will be on Monday 27th July when the students will be sent a google form which they are asked to fill in six 200 hour subjects in order of their preference. The six most popular subjects will then be notified to the students and they will choose which subject they would like to study. The process will then be repeated for the 100 hour subjects. It is important that parents check their emails during this time to be informed about the process.

Year 10

Year 10 parents have already been sent the video presentation for the electives for Year 11 2021. The students have filled in a survey about their future career paths and the subjects they are considering. The Leaders of Learning have made suggestions on the surveys and the Year 10 students will have these sheets returned to them today.

On Thursday 23rd July an interview day is provided. Every student is required to book an interview time with one of the teachers to discuss their choices. Parents can attend the interviews if they wish. After the interviews the students will then make their first selections and these selections will determine the lines at Mt St Pats for 2021. An exciting time for Year 10 as they contemplate their future. Parents can contact myself or Miss Serone if you have any concerns throughout the process.

Year 12

Year 12 will be completing their final assessments in Term 3 including the Trial Examinations which will take place in Weeks 3 and 4. A timetable has been shared today.

PDHPE YEAR 7 POOL AQUATICS PROGRAM

Year 7 PDHPE classes have, as part of the curriculum, a compulsory Pool Aquatics Program. These pool sessions have been re-scheduled to take place during afternoon double practical lessons during Term 3 and, in some cases, sport afternoons as these are times we can book the whole venue. Students will require:

- modest swimwear
- a towel
- a bag to carry wet towel and swimmers
- goggles would be an advantage

The program will include instruction on Water Entries, Survival Swim Stroke, Reach to Rescue Techniques, cold water immersion and emergency scenarios. Students will not need to be strong swimmers to complete these activities. Students will be assessed and put into ability groups and instructed by AustSwim qualified instructors.

The cost of the program is \$10.30 per session and students will complete 3 sessions. This amount will be included in your child's School Fees, or it can be paid in full at the Front Office. The class timetables are as follows:
